Matters arising from the 2020 AGM held in March 2021:

The Geoff Husband Memorial Trophy for 2021 was awarded to Chris Dennis
The O45s Hundred Tournament happened in September at Grampound Road CC - will run again
in 2022

The O50s/60s have moved under the umbrella of the Cornwall Cricket Board

Team Reports:

Friendly XI: A number of matches were cancelled for various reasons - 6 matches went ahead and 36 players were involved. Thanks were offered to Paul Higgins for organising. Players were encouraged to play in 1 or 2 matches a year to ensure Paul can field full sides.

ECB 50s XI: Only 4 matches were played in the group stages following the temporary withdrawal of the Channel Islands and matches conceded by Isle of Wight and Wiltshire. Remarkably 2 of the matches finished in ties. The team beat Somerset in the final group game to qualify for the knockout stages but were beaten by Wales in the round of 16. Jim McKenna and Jon Nance became the 8th and 9th players to reach 50 'caps' for the ECB 50s team.

SCC 50s XI: The team had a mixed season which finished with defeat at Middlesex in the plate competition. Anton Luiten became the 2nd player to reach 100 caps for our combined 50s/60s teams.

O60s: After a poor start the team excelled themselves by winning the National Vase competition in what was there 15th match of the season.

51 players from 30 clubs appeared in the 3 championship teams

Team changes for 2022:

O60s 2nd XI: A new team for 2022 playing in the National O60s 2nd XI competition. Matches will as with O60s 1st XI matches will be on Tuesdays. Stuart Ellis to captain and Paul Dawkins to be team manager.

SCC 50s X1: The Southern Counties Championship (SCC) have their AGM on November 21st. A number of changes were discussed all of which were supported by this forum:

Summary of proposed changes:

With 19 teams for 2022 the name of the competition is no longer reflective.

It is proposed to be renamed: 50+ 2nd XI Championship

Matches to move from Thursdays to Wednesdays

Players to not be allowed to play for 1st XI and 2nd XI in same week (Mon-Sun)

The current 3 matches for 1st XI making players ineligible for 2nd XI to be replaced with players who have played 4 1st XI group matches to be ineligible for 2nd XI knockout matches

New player eligibility rules do not apply to anyone aged 60+

Finance Report

£2449 in the bank meaning the season was just £159 short of breaking even Key income streams:

Sponsorship £1180

Membership Subs £500

Match Fees £2410

Cornwall CB £600

O45s Tournament £521

Travel, Accommodation, Officials Fees, Match Balls were the key expenses

2022 Fees / Expenses

Membership Fee: £20 per player (covers all teams) - must be paid by May 1st otherwise players

not eligible for selection.

Match Fee: £10

Travel:

No payment for travel to home games

Away games - passengers to pay driver £5 each towards travel costs

Away games - drivers to receive 12p per mile based on home postcode to away ground Drivers must take a minimum of 1 player or official to qualify for travel expenses. All drivers are encouraged to have full cars to minimise number if vehicles needed. A proposal was discussed to change 1 player or official to 2. It was agreed to review mid-season this proposal. If lots of cars that are claiming travel are going to away games with just 1 driver and 1 player/official in them it is likely the 2 player / official proposal will be implemented.

Umpires / Scorers : £30 each

Teas: £60 to host club

Note re teas - it was agreed that we would aim to provide teas for all home matches regardless of whether teams reciprocate when we play away.
