Please show due regard to the officials, coaches, other parents/carers, the opposition, the environment, and all others involved in the game. This applies to all Disability Cricket activities, Super 1s, Super 9s, and Champion Club sessions.

Enjoyment

Whilst watching a practice or game you are expected to conduct yourself in a responsible manner. Be supportive and show encouragement. Do not criticise, be aggressive or use bad language. What is expected of the players is also expected of the parents/carers. Please show a positive and supportive attitude.

Coaching Staff

Please remember that the role of the team, its individuals and activities is at the discretion of the coaching staff. Interference during practices or games is not permitted.

Relationships

It is expected that you foster a good relationship with the coaching staff based on honesty, trust and a mutual understanding through good communication. The same is expected of the coaches. We all want what is best for the player and the team.
