Rule 2.13 Delete: Cornwall Association of Cricket Groundskeepers - the CACG shall annually electat their AGM a representative to serve on the LMC.

Footnote: Not required as the CACG Hon Secretary is also the CCL Vice-Chair.

3 PROMOTION & RELEGATION

Rule 5.1.12 Add: Where a team finishes in a promotion place but is ineligible or unable to be promoted, then the team immediately below in the final league table shall be offered a promotion, provided the team meets all other requirements, including those in clauses 5.1.7 and 5.1.8 above. In the event of <u>two teams</u> being ineligible then the teamimmediately below shall be offered promotion.

Footnote: Allows for a second team to be promoted if two of the teams above are ineligible.

4 Rule 5.1.9.1 Amend to Read:

Only one team shall be guaranteed automatic promotion from each section of the bottom Division (East, West, or otherwise). However, in normal circumstances, two teams shall be relegated from each section of the division immediately above. The necessity to promote further teams or not shall be decided by the LMC. Any further teams shall be promoted, East or West as required.

5 REGISTRATION

Create New Rule 9.5:

Any player who joins a club at any time from 1 October to 30 September, and is league registered but without a Cornwall Cricket League playing record on play-cricket from the preceding season, must play for the team for which they first represent for a minimum of **five league games** that have commenced (including Premier T20 days - Rule 13.1.8). The player is also ineligible for any Cup games not involving that first selected team until they have participated in **five league games**.

Players with an *International Sportspersons Visa* are restricted to first-team matches.

Footnote: To avoid the problems of 2023 when six Tier 1 Clubs played their Category 3 players in a lower team, on eight occasions, before the 5/8 rule became applicable and made the player ineligible.

In the first innings, you lose one over from both sides' allocations for every full 6 minutes. Team A has already received 21 (we ignore the part-over) so the max time lost in the first innings is 29 overs lost per each team x 6 minutes = 174 minutes. But Team B only needs to be allocated 20 overs so you can lose another three minutes in the second innings to reduce them to 20. An allocation can never be anything other than a full number of overs.
