### Relationships

Foster good relationships with players, parents/carers and other coaches through good communication, honesty, trust and empathy

Build, instil and uphold a culture that encompasses positivity, creativity, desire, integrity and independence. Disability cricket sessions at S1s, S9s, Champion Clubs and schools can change lives and, in doing so, this is the greatest reward one can get as a coach.
