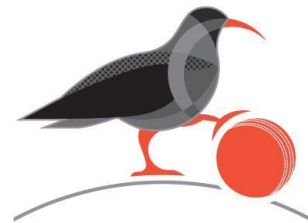

A PROGRESS EVENT:

- Organising a progress event can be a great way to culminate all the previous learning as part of a National Schools Programme. The event can be:
 - An Intra school event.
 - An Inter a school event (This case study).
 - An event organised in partnership with your local cricket club.
 - It could be in the form a game like rapid fire/non-stop cricket/kwik cricket or a multi skills circuit.
 - Remember the aim is to make it safe, fun and a bit of competition.
- In planning such as event consider the
 - STEP principle:
 - Space - you have
 - Task -required to be undertaken
 - Equipment - you need
 - People- are you are involving

- Dobwalls Community Primary School (NOR 196), a rural school with a strong farming community.
- The school focused on traditional sports in the area such as cross country and football.
- Cricket rarely featured in PE lessons and there has never been an after-school cricket club on offer.
- 2019, received the National Schools Programme (NSP), Chance to Shine (C2S) from Cornwall Cricket.
- Oli Jones (PE Coordinator) and his staff embraced the C2S NSP- during the CWC 2019 year - culminating in a model progress festival.
- The School held a CWC 2019 festival one afternoon using their Year 5 sports leaders who led ten activities for KSI.
- The afternoon was a celebration of cricket's diversity with a parade of nations and healthy competition.
- The school received excellent publicity with a full-page article in the local press and many people commented on it.

TIMELINE - DOBWALLS CP SCHOOL

- National Schools Programme input – Spring 2019 – 7 Weeks of activity
- 6 play sessions and 1 Learn session leading up to Progress event
- Progress event (Week 7) – World Cup multi-skills style festival devised in partnership by Cornwall Cricket and Oli Jones (PE Coordinator)
- Oli Jones trains his Year 5 Sports Leaders (Week 6)- 10 activities including their set up, marking and some creative adaptations of the play sessions
- Afternoon of events Main Hall is laid out with Flags of the ten CWC 2019 Nations and Teams assemble
- Participants and staff/helpers are given-safety briefing re, sun and hydration and expectations
- Mustafa Shaikh (assembly) gives a brief history of the CWC of the competing nations, Spirit of Cricket and declares CWC 2019 challenge open
- Each country then marches out of the Main Hall to undertake a flag parade around the field to musical anthem
- Each team now assembles at their first station and a 3 minute rotation of activities takes places with scores recorded by the Sports Leaders.
- After all ten activities - scorecards handed to Oli Jones for verification.
- Winners announced - medal presentation and vote of thanks from Cornwall Cricket
- CWC 2019 Progress event declared closed
