## CORNWALL COUNTY CRICKET CLUB COMMITTEE REPORT ON THE 2023 SEASON

Cornwall County Cricket Club had one of our most memorable seasons. In May we narrowly missed out by four runs in the National T20 final in a game that could have gone either way. We missed out on qualifying for the 50-over Trophy Quarter Finals on net run rate. The season ended with an unbeaten Championship campaign to clinch promotion to Division 1. In doing so we extended our record, to 25 successive seasons of winning a championship game.

The very wet Spring had an effect on the two-day warm-up game against Somerset Seconds at Taunton Vale in early April. Only a 40 overs a side was possible on the second afternoon. Later in the month, the Wadebridge groundstaff worked tirelessly after heavy rain the previous day to enable the T20 games against Wiltshire to be played. Following a six-over thrash, which we won by nine wickets, we also won the second game by a comfortable six wickets with four overs to spare. We lost to Dorset by 41 runs at the new venue of Milton Abbey School but bounced back to win the second game by nine runs with professional Will MacVicar taking five wickets and Jake Libby making 77. Honours were even against Herefordshire on May Bank Holiday at Werrington before two wins against Devon at Cornwood secured a place at Finals Day. The first was narrow by three wickets with two balls to spare. Christian Purchase hit 66 as we won the second encounter by eight wickets with eight overs to spare. We beat Hertfordshire at Tring in the semi-final by five wickets with 22 balls to spare thanks to Chris Gibson's unbeaten 66. In the final we seemed to have done the hard work to dismiss Staffordshire for 119 in the first-ever meeting of the counties. We just fell short however ending on 115-9.

The Trophy campaign began with a high-scoring Bank Holiday win at Truro as we hit 303-8 against Devon to win the Peninsula Cup by 36 runs. Max Tryfonos took five wickets after Jack Paull, Paul Smith and MacVicar hit half-centuries. In hot conditions at Slough Berkshire made 319-7. We were 52 without loss in the sixth over when a heavy thunderstorm saw the match abandoned as a No Result. We kept our hopes alive with a four-wicket win over Bedfordshire at Redruth. After Adam Hodgson took five wickets, five years after his last game MacVicar's unbeaten 84 gained victory with three overs and four wickets to spare. Former skipper Tom Sharp played a key role with the ball in a surprise comeback game due to player unavailability. The final group game saw Hertfordshire gain revenge for the T20 defeat with a 118-run win at North Mymms to top the group. Berkshire beat Bedfordshire and in doing so overtook us to qualify on net run rate.

The Championship season began at Truro where we took a first innings lead of 152 runs against Dorset with Alex Blake hitting 102 on debut. The visitors dug in to draw the game ending 271-5. Against Shropshire at Bridgnorth Blake was called up midgame to play for Kent, after a four-year gap, against Notts at Trent Bridge. The rules allowed us to give a debut to Notts Academy player Fateh Singh Lamba as a substitute player after a hasty mid-game registration process. After a MacVicar century we took a lead of 111 runs. In a dramatic final session run-chase we got the 148 to win by five wickets with seven balls to spare. Late on a rain-delayed final day at St Austell we completed back-to-back championship victories for the first time in seven years. This despite conceding a deficit of 82 runs on the first innings against Wiltshire. Tryfonos took ten wickets in the match as we reached 194-8 to win by two wickets in a tense finish with an hour to spare. We comfortably got the draw required to take the Division Two title against Wales NC at Abergavenny. The home side led by 101 runs on first innings and needing 252 in a minimum of 55 overs we reached 145 for 3 when the captains shook hands at the start of the final hour.

In the Showcase game with Somerset CCC at Truro the visitors made 323-9 and we lost by 63 runs on the DLS method having reached 110-4 in 22 overs when the predicted rain arrived shortly before five o'clock.

It was a successful first full season in charge for Paul Smith, who seeks re-election unopposed in 2024.

We used 33 players with 11 making debuts.

Wadebridge Cricket Club managed to get conditions playable as volunteers worked tirelessly after a day of heavy rain had stopped on Saturday tea time. Their efforts looked to be in vain when a further downpour arrived at the Riverside on Sunday morning but thanks to the willingness of the umpires, and both teams, play got underway just before two o'clock.

The first game was reduced to six overs a side. Paul Smith won a vital toss and the visitors struggled losing six wickets for 26 with Ben Ellis taking 3-13 in his two overs. Needing 40 Penzance's Ben Seabrook, on his debut, hit 21 not out. The former Cambridgeshire player hit two sixes as the target was reached with eleven balls and nine wickets to spare.

The second game was played out over a full 20 overs in bright but cold conditions. Ed Young and keeper Ben Draper both made 33 to post 131-6. Beacon's Jordan Thomas took 3-20 from four overs and Ellis completed a good day with 2-23. After Seabrook departed to the second ball of the innings Christian Purchase and Smith put on 77 in seven overs. Smith hit three sixes in his 35 and Purchase 4 sixes in his 56 before falling at 103-3 at the beginning of the 13th over. Dorset hosted an NCCA fixture for the first time in the 97 acres of Milton Abbey School near Blandford Forum. Morning rain meant a delayed start of an hour but no overs were lost. Dorset convincingly won the first game by 41 runs. However, Cornwall fought back to clinch the second encounter by nine runs. It means both teams have lost a group game but Dorset's cancelled game with Devon means Cornwall will top the group and make it to T20 Finals Day for the first time if they were to win the remaining four games.

Former Cornwall player Sam Young made 43 to see Dorset to 127-6. Max Trythonos and Jake Libby took two wickets. After losing Christian Purchase to the second ball, Libby, playing his first Cornwall game for five years, made 17. Skipper Paul Smith batted well for 34 but the innings subsided from 59-2 to 86 all out at the beginning of the 17th over. Hampshire's Tom Prest did the damage taking 5-15.

In the second game Purchase again departed in the opening over but Libby anchored the innings making 77 that included 4 sixes. He was dismissed with three balls remaining, one of which new batter Joe Phillips hit for a straight six. Crucially 42 runs had come off the last three overs of the innings. Dorset's reply centred around Hampshire and Southern Brave's Ross Whiteley, who famously hit 6 sixes for Worcestershire against Yorkshire in the T20 Blast in 2017. With over 350 First Class and one-day appearances, the left-hander hit three maximums before new Cornwall professional Will MacVicar had him caught by Libby for 41. The home side required a further 23 off 16 balls, with four wickets remaining, but MacVicar wrapped up the tail with three balls to spare to end with 5-19.

There was a win apiece at Werrington on Bank Holiday Monday following an overnight stopover at Exeter. Herefordshire were restricted to 84-8 losing their last five wickets for two runs. We were struggling at 17-4 off five overs but MacVicar's crucial 37 set up the win with eight balls to spare.

The visitors made 126 all out the second time around losing their last five wickets to Dan Lello for the addition of six runs. Lewis Goldsworthy, released by Somerset to play in the game, wrapped up Devon's innings by performing the hat-trick in the final over. The three dot balls proved vital. After Christian Purchase opened with 34 we slowed up and needed eight off the final over. That became seven off four balls in a tense finish but Sturgess hit a four and a six to claim a three-wicket victory with two balls remaining.

The second game was far more comfortable with an eight-wicket success gained with almost eight overs to spare. Spinners Goldsworthy and Tryfonos shared six wickets and the target of 121 was easily achieved after Purchase and Gibson put on 95 inside ten overs. Purchase hit 6 sixes and 6 fours in his 66. Xavier Clarke made 31 but a mini-collapse saw the home side slip to 184-<br/>6 off 36 overs. However, 16-year-old Kian Roberts, son of former Cornwall and Northants batter David, then played excellent<br/>innings on debut.

He hit his first delivery for a boundary and went on to make 32 off 23 balls, adding 53 for the seventh wicket with Smith. The skipper went on to make an unbeaten 60 off 45 balls. Tommy Sturgess played a cameo hitting 4 sixes in his 32 off 19 balls before being caught in the deep in the final over.

The 303-8 was Cornwall's ninth-highest in the 41 years of the competition and the best against Devon in the 24 meetings. Josh Thomas and James Horler put on 80 for Devon's first wicket.

We finally laid to rest a 40-year hoodoo to beat Shropshire at Bridgnorth, by five wickets with seven balls to spare. It was a first-ever success at Cricket Meadow at the ninth attempt and the only the second win in a 2 or 3-day game on Shropshire soil since Team Manager Godfrey's Furse's debut game in 1985, when he hit the winning runs. Former Cornwall batter Ollie Westbury hit a century for Shropshire in their 316. Cornwall replied with their eighth-highest score of 427 with professionals Will MacVicar (116) and Alex Blake (73) leading the way. Mid-game Blake was called up to play for Kent at Trent Bridge in the LV County Championship and under the NCCA playing conditions a substitute player was hastily registered and allowed to bat and bowl. Fateh Singh, a Notts Academy England Under 19, duly dashed to the ground and took a wicket with his first ball. Shropshire were dismissed for 258 with Ellis Whiteford taking seven wickets in the match. Cornwall were left 148 to win but in only 24 overs due to a couple of rain delays. In a tense finish, Tommy Sturgess hit 36 not out off 17 balls to secure a famous win.

Overseas signing, Curtis Campher made an impressive debut for Somerset hitting a century as he helped his new side to a 63 runs (DLS Method) victory. A wet outfield meant that the start of the match was delayed by 30 minutes which led to the game being reduced to 47 overs per side. Campher then made an impression with the ball. He was brought into the attack to bowl the 11th over and removed Will MacVicar with his very first delivery in Somerset colours, bowling the Cornwall number three for six at 38 for two. He then removed Xavier Clarke (9) in his second over, to leave the hosts on 56 for three in the 13th over. Dan Jenkin top-edged a short one from Langridge through to James Rew without any further addition to the score but Max Tryfonos and Paul Smith batted determinedly and brought up the Cornwall hundred in the 21st over. The pair had taken their partnership past the 50-mark and the score to 110 for four in the 22nd over when rain forced the players from the field just before five o'clock

Truro – Somerset 323-9 (47) (C Campher 107, G Thomas 78, S Dickson 41, J Thomas 35; B Ellis 2-57, C Donnelly 2-61, M Lawrence 2-72) beat Cornwall 110-4 (22) (PS Smith 29no, MM Tryfonos 21no, DE Jenkin 20; C Campher 2-27) by 63 runs (DLS Method).

Over the season we used 16 players in the Championship, with eight (Smith, Ellis, Hodgson, Leathley, Lawrence, MacVicar, Tryfonos & Whiteford) playing in all four games. There were championship debuts for eight players – WA MacVicar, RX Clarke, M Lawrence, DE Jenkin, AJ Blake, AG MacDonald, Feteh Landa & LG Weeks. MacVicar, Tryfonos & Sturgess were capped.

Will MacVicar made 286 runs at an average of 47.67, including the highest score (116). Ellis Whiteford was the leading wicket-taker with 17 wickets at 23.00 each. Max Tryfonos had match figures of 10-104 and the season best of 5-35. The highest partnership was the 164 by Alex Blake & Karl Leathley against Dorset

In the NCCA Trophy, 21 players took part in the four games with four (Smith, Ellis, MacVicar & Tryfonos), playing all four. games. Eleven players – Purchase, Gibson, Dinnis, Seabrook, Paull, Kent, Roberts, Donnelly, Sharp, Turpin and Andrew Libby played in Trophy games but not in the Championship.

Will MacVicar made the top score of 84no. Max Tryfonos took nine wickets. The highest partnership was the 102 by Jack Paull and MacVicar against Devon.

In the NCCA T20 competition 17 players took part in the ten games with seven (Smith, Bone, Ellis, Purchase, Phillips Sturgess & Tryfonos) playing all ten games. Ten players – Dinnis, Gibson, Goldsworthy, Lello, Jake Libby, Purchase, Phillips, Seabrook, Thomas & Wells, played in T20 games but not in the Championship.

Jake Libby made the top score of 77 and Sturgess & Tryfonos both took 16wickets. The highest partnership was the 95 by Chris Gibson & Christian Purchase against Devon.

A total of 33 players represented the county in NCCA competitions in 2023.

Tommy Sturgess played in the winning NCCA Representative team in Spain in October.

Our thanks to Dave Eggins who again carried out the scoring duties. The usual vote of thanks is extended to our host clubs, their grounds staff, and their caterers for their excellent hospitality. The committee also thanks the local media for their coverage during 2023. Finally, the club was grateful again to Richard Sharp for producing the match scorecards during the season.

The format change should see the end of dead rubbers and less travel in the group stages. Season is starting two weeks later than last year.

#### Development XI 2023 Report (Rob Harrison)

.During 2023 Cornwall Development Squad (Choughs) played a number of fixtures throughout the season across 3 formats, including T20, 50 overs and a 2-day match.

The season started with the appointment of Rob Harrison as Development Manager of the team, and the Cornwall CCC would like to thank Chris Hunkin for the time and energy he put into the development team.

Cornwall Development XI played 5 fixtures over 5 days in the 2023 season. Our first fixture took place at Truro CC in 2 x T20 matches against the Cornwall CCC, this was a great start to the season giving Cornwall Captain Paul Smith the opportunity to see all 22 players in action across the 2 matches, ahead of Cornwall's opening T20 fixture. Cornwall Development XI lost both matches.

Our second fixture was a 50-over white ball match held at Paul CC v Cornwall U18, Cornwall Development XI dominated this match bowling the Under 18 out for 138 within 41 overs and chasing the 138 in 23 overs, a great performance to take into the next matches.

The third match was a 2-day fixture held at Falmouth v Devon Lions. Cornwall Development XI with a young side lost to a strong Devon Lion side, but each player had something to take away from the match and work on in future games – 2-day cricket is a great transition into 3-day cricket and the earlier exposure to this the better for players with aspirations of playing at the highest level.
