A fine of £20 will be imposed for a non-return of an online ballot Rule 3.4.1.8.1

Rule 1.9.4: At the AGM, a simple majority of more than 50% of votes cast is required to pass any alteration, amendment, correction or change of League Rules and for the election of any officer or Committee member.

	1.10.1		An Extraordinary General Meeting (EGM) of all clubs (stakeholders) may be called at a written request of at least 25% of clubs or by the LMC.
	1.10.2		An EGM, properly constituted shall have the status and authority of an AGM and any decisions made shall be binding.
	1.10.3		The EGM shall be held within 28 days of the valid request being received by the League Secretary.
	1.10.4		<u>Calling the EGM of all Clubs</u> These League Rules and Regulations will state the conditions under which an EGM is to be called.
	1.10.4.1		The number and names of the Club backers with written confirmation of their agreements(s) that an EGM is requested and their proposed resolution(s); together with the names of any attendees (non-stakeholders) that the Club backers or the LMC may wish to speak or to present written information on their behalf at the EGM.
	1.10.4.2		The proposed resolutions to be considered and full accompanying information are limited to a max of 3 – to permit full and open discussion of views of all League Clubs - the resolutions must have a single central theme and be co-related
	1.10.4.3		The LMC has the right to reject resolutions if; <ul style="list-style-type: none"> a. In the opinion of the LMC, the resolution(s) do not require the immediacy of consideration at an EGM, i.e. the resolutions can be deferred to the next AGM without loss of value or status. b. In the opinion of the LMC, the resolutions run contrary to ECB legal requirements and standards or are either illegal or immoral. c. In the opinion of the LMC, the resolutions are frivolous.
	1.10.4.4		An EGM is to be attended in person with one representative from each Club, unless EGM regulations allow provision for a prior confidential EGM eVote to be used in the case of a virtual or hybrid EGM or if the Club representative cannot attend an EGM in person; all eVotes must remain confidential until the closure of the EGM and only the totals disclosed after the EGM.
	1.10.4.5		A representative of every Club must attend an EGM, of whatever format. A vote shall be recorded for every Club.
	1.10.4.6		All Clubs are to receive written notice of the resolution(s), with all background and other relevant information (from both backers and LMC (if required)) on the resolution(s), to be considered, at least 14 days before the EGM date that will enable them to lodge a vote(s), if required, in a confidential EGM eVote before the EGM.

- (i) **Play-Cricket Registrations Annual Request** - To aid player communications the ECB have requested that Cornwall Cricket League members/players should individually **sign up** for membership of your club play-cricket site (top right of each homepage) and tick the box to allow communications from the ECB. It also now allows players to view their stats. Only **48%** have signed up of the current 3860 registered league players.

This process is opposed to the default “Temporary Player Membership” awarded by clubs that register players themselves. Once a member/player has entered their details, and applied for membership, they can be approved by your ClubAdministrator and are eligible to be given web roles on your site. They will also be able to receive the weekly Cornwall Honours Boards email from ECB. The League will annually remove registrations of players who have not played in the **last two seasons**.
