Rule 1.9.4: At the AGM, a simple majority of more than 50% of votes cast is required to pass any alteration, amendment, correction or change of League Rules and for the election of any officer or Committee member.

Rule 9.4 LOAN PLAYERS

Create New Rule:

1

A loan player may not bat higher than **number SEVEN** or bowl until **50% of the overs** available in the innings have expired.

The Captains may mutually agree to waive this rule to allow a loan player **unrestricted participation**. Both Captains must sign their acceptance of such agreement on the official result form before the match commences.

Footnote: The loan system is not designed to artificially strengthen teams with higher-order batters and front-line bowlers from other clubs.

(i) Play-Cricket Registrations Annual Request - To aid player communications the ECB have requested that Cornwall Cricket League members/players should individually sign up for membership of your club play-cricket site (top right of each homepage) and tick the box to allow communications from the ECB. It also now allows players to view their stats. Only 48% have signed up of the current 3860 registered league players.

This process is opposed to the default "Temporary Player Membership" awarded by clubs that register players themselves. Once a member/player has entered their details, and applied for membership, they can be been approved by your ClubAdministrator and are eligible to be given web roles on your site. They will also be able to receive the weekly Cornwall Honours Boards email from ECB. The League will annually remove registrations of players who have not played in the <u>last two seasons</u>.
