CORNWALL COUNTY CRICKET CLUB COMMITTEE REPORT ON THE 2021 SEASON

The year ended sadly with the passing of former Chairman and President **Col Ronnie Potts TD, JP, DL** at the age of 93. He had served the club for almost fifty years. Ronnie joined the committee in April 1971 representing his affiliated club, Pencarrow. The following year he was elected as a general committee member in his own right. He also joined the selection committee that year, a post he was to hold until 2011. He was appointed the Club Chairman in 1989 following the sudden death of Leslie Northey. Ronnie was made a Life Member in 2001 and awarded the Arthur Lugg Cup in 2007 for services to the club. In 2012 he succeeded Father Ken Rogers as the Club President and stood down in March 2018, in the week of his ninetieth birthday. He had served continuously on the committee for 47 years. He passed away at his Bodmin home on Armistice Day - 11 November.

It was a mixed season on the field with two wins and two defeats in the Trophy to narrowly miss out on the quarter-finals on net run rate. In the Championship we finished third in the new-look Division 2 with a win, a defeat and two draws.

For the second successive year, the NCCA T20 competition was cancelled as Covid restrictions didn't begin to get lifted until mid -April. A warm-up game against Devon at Bovey Tracey on Sunday 23 May was cancelled on the previous evening due to a waterlogged pitch.

Our Trophy campaign began with a last-ball defeat to Dorset, chasing 278. A victory at Herefordshire followed by three wickets but hopes of progress suffered a blow when we ended 15 runs short of victory at home to Devon. It meant both ourselves and Wiltshire knew victory in quick time was required to get through on net run rate. Rain reduced our target to 193 in 25 overs. We won by two wickets but, crucially, were 25 runs short at the NRR cut off in the 14th over.

We gave seven championship debuts at Wales in a rain ruined game that petered out to a draw. Against the odds, we then beat Devon by 39 runs after being effectively 54-7 in our second innings, before 112 were added. At Shropshire, we failed to capitalise on a 74 run first innings lead and went down to a six-wicket defeat. Finally, champions Herefordshire set us 307 and we comfortably saw out the draw at 191-4.

Arguably, our season highlight came in the first-class showcase game against Somerset in July at Taunton. Skipper Scott Harvey, after keeping wicket, then hit an unbeaten 93 as we chased down 260, with five wickets and 22 balls to spare.

Our first competitive match since the championship win over Devon in September 2019 ended in disappointment with the last ball defeat against Dorset. We lost Matt Robins to the third ball of the innings but Lewis Goldsworthy (52), Greg Smith (32) and Tom Wells (20) laid a foundation. Paul Smith, returning to his former club, then hammered a county best 94 not out including 7 sixes and 7 fours off 63 balls. With skipper Scott Harvey getting 24 and Dan Lello 28 Cornwall got to 277-7 in their 50 overs. In a hectic finish, 92 came off the last seven overs.

Harry Carne (60) and Luke Webb (55) led the Dorset reply but the game was in the balance at 174-5 with 16 overs remaining. The eighth wicket fell at 261 leaving 17 needed off 14 balls. That became 11 off the last over but two boundaries including an edge proved crucial. The scores were tied off the penultimate ball and with the fielders surrounding tailender Robert Wigley, he scrambled a single off the final ball. Keeper Ed Ellis was unbeaten on 56. Dan Lello took 3-51 with two each for Goldsworthy and Tommy Sturgess.

Two late changes saw St Just's Ben Ellis called up for a debut and Penzance's Jonny Ludlam replacing Tommy Sturgess and Tim Wyatt.

Herefordshire recovered from 120-6 to be bowled out off the penultimate ball for 194. After Nick Hammond topped scored with 36. Tom Hage rallied the tail with 34 before James Rudge (18) added a useful 28 for the last wicket. Debutants Ben Ellis, a late replacement, took 2-32 and left-arm spinner Craig Johnson 1-25 from a tidy ten overs. Another late call-up, Jonny Ludlam, took 3-31 and Tom Wells 3-55.

Cornwall's reply got off to a rocky start losing Alex Bone at 16 and Greg Smith and debutant Scott Kellow soon followed both failing to score. Christian Purchase (16) followed at 32-4. Wells and Paul Smith (31) added a valuable 79 for the fifth wicket. Wells went on to make 73 but his dismissal, and Kian Burns soon after, meant at 143-7 the game was in the balance. Skipper Scott Harvey (28no) and Jonny Ludlam (26no) secured victory in a tense finish with an unbeaten eighth-wicket stand of 55.

After Ben Ellis struck twice to reduce the visitors to 28-2 Devon recovered to make 249 for 8. Matt Golding hit a century and shared a stand of 183 for the third wicket with Matt Thompson, who contributed 80. Tom Wells took three wickets as Cornwall fought back in the last ten overs to be set a target of 250.

Christian Purchase (37) and Alex Bone (26) added 60 for Cornwall's first wicket. Wells (54) and Greg Smith (57) then put on 101 as Cornwall reached 166 before losing their third wicket. No one else got going, however, and with 47 needed off the last five overs, the task proved too much for the tail. Cornwall needs to win their final group game away to Wiltshire to stand a chance of possible qualification for the quarter-finals on net run rate.

Our hopes of reaching the Quarter-Finals were ended at Warminster despite victory over Wiltshire. Both sides went into the game knowing a convincing win was needed to overtake Herefordshire's net run rate. They had completed their four group games. If a full 50 over-game was completed Cornwall and Wiltshire both needed either around 80 runs winning margins or passing the target in around 33- 35 overs.

In the circumstances, Scott Harvey won a useful toss and elected to field first. With Ben Ellis picking up two wickets the hosts were reduced to 92-4 in the 19th over. However, Durham batsman Cameron Steel, currently on loan to Hampshire and with a double first-class century against Leicestershire in 2017, made 109. Ed Young (66) put on 118 for the fifth wicket. After a shower saw an early lunch taken and a further downpour meant Wiltshire's innings closed after 41.2 overs at 248-7.

The Duckworth Lewis calculation resulted in a target of 193 from 25 overs. However, to achieve the necessary net run rate the Cornwall target need to be reached in just 13 overs and three balls - a daunting ask of 14.3 an over.

Despite only two runs coming off the first over Cornwall were going well at 110-3 off eight overs with Christian Purchase making 17 and Tom Wells 27 off eight balls, including 4 sixes. Crucially in the ninth over Greg Smith fell for 65 off 30 balls (6 sixes and 4 fours) and Paul Smith followed to the next ball. Dan Lello hit 3 sixes in his 32. The NRR cut off point came in the 14th over with Cornwall 25 runs short of victory. Jonny Ludlam (20no) and Ben Ellis (16no) went on to secure a bitter-sweet success with 26 balls to spare.

The winner takes all game at Dorchester saw Devon (6pts) win the group with a narrow six-run Duckworth Lewis victory over Dorset. After rain delays, the target was 144 from 32 overs but Dorset were bowled out for 137 with two balls remaining.

Herefordshire qualified in second spot with Cornwall and Dorset also ending on four points.

We started our Championship season with a rain ruined draw against Wales National Counties at Pontarddulais. Less than a couple of hours were possible before rain washed out the opening day. A torrential downpour during the lunch interval on day two saw rain get under the covers and play was abandoned for the day. Cornwall had just been bowled out for 157 in 65 overs with Chris Gibson making 56 on debut. The third day was uninterrupted with Wales bowled out for 271 at tea. Tommy Sturgess and former Worcestershire spinner Ben Twohig took three wickets on his first appearance. Trailing by 114 runs Cornwall batted out the final session ending on 79-1 with skipper Scott Harvey 43 not out and Ollie Westbury, another former Worcestershire player, 25 not out on debut.

NCCA Championship1 - 3 AugustCornwall 206 & 240,Devon 280 & 127at Truro

We recorded a famous Championship victory, against the odds by beating Devon at Truro by 39 runs. After electing to bat Cornwall were reduced to 9-3 on the first morning. In a recovery, Paul Smith made 59 and Matt Robins 49 to be bowled out for 206 in the 69th over. Seamer Kas Szymanski took 5-42. Devon were going well on the second morning before losing six for 36 in the 13 overs before lunch to only lead by six runs at the interval with eight wickets down. However, professional Callum Haggett, the former Kent all-rounder, hit 61 and the ninth-wicket stand of 59 with Dan Goodey secured a first-innings lead of 74 runs.

Cornwall closed the day on 148-7 after Ollie Westbury (22), Chris Gibson (30) and Robins (26) all got starts. Starting day three effectively 74-7 Cornwall survived until lunch with the last three wickets adding a crucial 112 runs. Ben Ellis (30) and Craig Johnson added 45 for the tenth wicket after Smith (53) and Tommy Sturgess (27) put on 59 for the eighth. Devon skipper and former Falmouth player Jamie Stephens took 5-58 to end with eight wickets in the match.

Devon were set 167 in two sessions and a minimum of 56 overs. After reaching 112-4 after tea they were bowled out six minutes into the last hour for 127 with Ellis Whiteford and Craig Johnson taking four wickets each. The last five wickets fell for just five runs in a dramatic collapse. It was a third successive Championship win over Devon (four in five) and a sixth successive three-day victory at Truro against all counties.

Cornwall recovered well on the opening day of their NCCA Championship game with Shropshire at Bridgnorth. Having been 50 for three they batted through the day to be all out for 317 with Ollie Westbury making 124 and Matt Robins 73. The former Warwickshire, Derbyshire and Glamorgan all-rounder Graham Wagg took six wickets. Opener Ollie Westbury was eighth out at 307 (88.2) having batted for 345 minutes, facing 250 balls and hitting 12 fours. The fourth-wicket stand with Matt Robins added 114 runs. Shropshire recovered from 102-6 to reach 243 thanks to Xavier Clark and wicket-keeper Ben Lees, playing on his home club ground. Cornwall led by 74 runs on the first innings having co-incidentally trailed by 74 runs against Devon in the previous game. At the close of day 2 Cornwall led by 181 runs with six wickets remaining. Paul Smith fractured a thumb in

the field so unlikely to bat. We collapsed to be all out at 12.38 on the third morning losing the last six wickets for 33 runs. Graham Wagg ended with match figures of 50.2-14-107-10. Shropshire were set 224 to win. They reached the target at 5pm for the loss of four wickets thanks to an unbroken century from opener George Hargrave. Cornwall's defeat means Herefordshire's win over Wales NC by 70 runs shortly after lunch saw them win the Western Division 2 title ahead of their final game against Cornwall at St Austell.

In a late change, Alex Bone replaced Craig Johnson who was injured at Bridgnorth. Seventeen-year-old Joe Phillips made his debut. We batted out the final day of the NCCA Championship season to earn a draw against the division winners. On day one Herefordshire added 77 for their last three wickets to end on 235. Scott Harvey took four catches and a stumping. Cornwall were dismissed for 149 to trail by 86 runs. Herefordshire declared 35 minutes into the third morning on 220-7, though it did take them 83 overs with Ellis Whiteford taking 5-58 from 29 overs. It left Cornwall 307 to win from a minimum of 90 overs. Harvey (56no) and James Turpin (41no) shared a fifth-wicket stand to see hands shaken at 6 pm, halfway through the final hour.

Skipper Scott Harvey made a county best 93 not out and Truro teammate Charlie Kent hit 60 in adding 72 for the second wicket. Kian Burns and Paul Smith departed within a run at 180-4 with 15 overs remaining. Scott Kellow (28) added 68 with Harvey before being dismissed with 13 required off 31 balls. Over the season we used 17 players in the championship, with five (Harvey, Westbury, Sturgess, Ellis and Whiteford) playing in all four games. There were championship debuts for eight players – KJ Burns, CF Gibson, BA Ellis, CM Johnson, SP Kellow, JP Phillips, BJ Twohig, OE Westbury. No players were capped.

Matt Robins made 249 runs at an average of 41.50, Oliver Westbury 246 runs at 35.14 including the only century (124). Ellis Whiteford was the leading wicket-taker with 18 wickets at 24.83 each and had the best return of 5-58.

In the NCCA Trophy, 18 players took part in the four games with Harvey, Greg Smith, Wells and Burns playing all four. games. Eight players – Goldsworthy, Ludlam, Wells, Greg Smith, Purchase, Lello, Angove and Dinnis played in Trophy games only.

Paul Smith made the top score of 94. Wells took eight wickets. The highest partnership was the 101 by Greg Smith & Tom Wells against Devon.

A total of 25 players represented the county in NCCA competitions in 2021.

Our thanks to Dave Eggins who again carried out the scoring duties. The usual vote of thanks is extended to our host clubs, their grounds staff, and their caterers for their excellent hospitality. Particular thanks in the first part of the season when Covid criteria were in place at venues. Thanks to Mark Thomas for taking on the Covid Officer role. The committee also thanks to the local media for their coverage during 2021. Finally, the club was grateful again to Richard Sharp for producing the match scorecards during the season.
