
VINGOE FAMILY LAW ANDREW CUP 2024



CCL CUP RULES 17.1 & 17.3 apply & include:

The first-named club shall play at home. Matches must be played on the set dates or earlier by mutual agreement.

Result Reporting - Home clubs **MUST** input a minimum of a play-cricket summary result **within 24 hours** of the match being played. Matches will consist of **TWENTY OVERS** with no bowler allowed to bowl more than **FOUR** overs.

Abandoned Matches – **New 2024** <u>FIVE</u> overs in the second innings constitutes a match. Average run rate to apply in the event of an abandonment but the DLS method to apply in SFs & Final only.

Postponed Matches – DO NOT enter a result on play-cricket (e.g. Abandoned or Cancelled) as this effectively ends the match online. Simply type in the new rearranged fixture date ONLY and leave the rest blank.

No regular Premier, County 1 or Division 2 player is eligible to play at any stage in the Andrew Cup. A regular player is one played 5 of the last 8 games that have commenced for the higher team in the current or previous season.

No Fielding Restrictions in the Andrew Cup.

Balls – for all matches before the semi-finals and finals, the home side must provide sound league approved cricket balls and sufficient spares of the same standard; the match ball and spares must be lodged with the umpires before the start of the match. Pink Magna balls are permitted and optional in any round of a T20 competition at the discretion of the home club. The LMC will provide new 'Pink Magna' balls for each innings for each semi-final and final. **Coloured Clothing** (not predominantly pink or red) is permitted and optional in any T20 match.

Free Hit after a No Ball

The delivery following any no ball shall be a free hit for whichever batsman is facing it. If the delivery for the free hit is not a legitimate delivery (any kind of no ball or a wide ball) then the next delivery will become a free hit for whichever batsman is facing it.
