Headteacher Sian Hall said 'I felt it was vitally important that PE, School Sport and Physical activity formed an integral part of our Recovery Curriculum on a full return to school in September.

Research published by the YST in the Summer concluded that;

- Those who are fitter and healthier have coped better, physically and mentally with the pandemic.
- Activity levels in young people have fallen from 47% doing the recommended 60mins a day to only 19%.

Sian continued 'By welcoming Cornwall Cricket into school we were able to enhance our PE curriculum and allow them to benefit from specialist coaching, whilst adhering to the DFE Guidance for Full Opening of Schools. Mr Anderson (Mr.A) quickly built up a rapport with the children and extended the constraints that working in a small class bubble has. The cricket coaching engaged and enthused the children who were keen to replicate activities at break times and lunchtimes in the playground. With a continued relationship we are able to give children in school the pathway to local cricket clubs and beyond.'
